Dialogues | Politics and Society Institute hosts Jordanian Foreign Minister Ayman Safadi in a round table to discuss Jordanian Diplomacy: Priorities and Challenges of the New Year

The Institute of Politics and Society held a round table, "Jordanian Diplomacy in 2023: Priorities and Challenges," to discuss the priorities and strategic issues on the Jordanian diplomatic agenda in 2023, which hosted the Jordanian Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs, H.E. Ayman Safadi, with the participation of a group of political analysts, academics, and experts in international politics, and the presence of Honorary President of the Institute, Sharif Shaker bin Zaid, and Chairman of the Board of Trustees, Eng. Muhammad Saqr.

In the round table, Safadi discussed strategic issues and how Jordan views its priorities at the diplomatic level this year. He touched on the most important challenges facing Jordanian diplomacy this year, and what the options are for handling them.

In a related context, Al-Safadi clarified Jordan's national strategic interests during this year, how we classify sources of threat, in addition to how we define the values and policies that govern the handling of Jordanian diplomacy in navigating the troubled region.
